This class is about how to design democratic governance. It will follow two paths.

First, to understand how to design democratic governance, I believe we must understand the evolution of how societies have been and are governed. We will begin at the emergence of society governance. The goal is to be able to tell a (true) story about how society governance has changed, and sometimes improved, and how those changes have manifested themselves in the lives of the populations of those societies.

Second, we will explore a way to design a democracy: Democracy 2.0. D2 is a set of three extensions to current democratic governance. I have developed many of the things needed to make D2 possible. I will explain them to you and seek your input as to how I can make a better case for D2.

We will identify innovations in governance that transform how societies function in terms of the well-being of the populations, especially innovations that become widely adopted by other societies. We will also look at innovations that generated very different outcomes. We will examine some of the many forms of state governance. Most importantly, we will trace through the rise of democratic governance: the broadening of the pool of people who have at least some say in how the society should be governed, the strengthening of the rule of law, and expansion in the liberties the government protects.
